

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT 2017

The Association of the Church of God of Southern California exists to be:

A force of God,

Uniting His Church

To impact communities for Christ.

The joy of ministry has remained fresh and fulfilling for me. I am in my 40th year of serving the Lord in ministry within the Church of God. He has been good at giving strength, encouragement, joy, peace, understanding, faith, and the companionship of so many, many wonderful co-laborers throughout this whole time. Next to knowing Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord, then being married to Kim for these 37 years, and being a dad, now a granddad, serving with you is the greatest privilege of my life.

I read an article in a science magazine while in a doctor's waiting room a few weeks ago. It was a very interesting article about criminal investigation, and how far technology has brought us in being able to discover so much information through fingerprints. Among other things, they are able to now tell how long fingerprints have been on items by the depth of the print and the acid level remaining. They can also tell what gender left the print. There was much more to the article.

I got to thinking about fingerprints. I got to thinking of the fingerprints that have marked this Association over our history. While the times, places, and faces of this assembly have changed over the years, one thing that has not changed is the sense that God has marked us as His own, and that His blessing is upon us.

If we were to dust for God's fingerprints, we would find them everywhere. We would find them on our hearts, as He continues to shape us and mold us into the likeness of his son, Jesus Christ. We would find God's thumb prints on our backs as He compels us to start new works, to deepen our commitment, and to increase our willingness to take fresh risks for the Kingdom. We would find God's fingerprints on new ministries, new churches, and new converts.

And it is not just God's fingerprints that have marked this Association. There are also the fingerprints of women and men God has used to shape us and form us. Over the last few months I have read through minutes of the Ministerial Conference dating back to the 1920's. The experience left me with a few deep impressions: 1) great appreciation for those who have led the church and how God used each of them; 2) profound admiration for the significant sacrifices our pastors and laity have made throughout our history; 3) a renewed commitment to our mission to evangelize Southern California and Southern Nevada with the message of God's transforming grace, to make disciples throughout this region and beyond, always inviting individuals to engage in the story of God.

Today I thank God for our wonderful ministry teams. Their fingerprints, too, are everywhere!! It is a joy to work alongside our Association President Ralph Sims, Association Vice-Presidents Janet Werdowatz and Earl Gotts, Association Secretary Brent Miller, Youth Ministries' Team Chair Gina Gardner, Children's' Ministries Team Chair Kimberly Winn, Church Multiplication Team Chair Mike Gratzke, Concilio President Dominico Carrera, special advisor with youth and college ministries Kathy Reed, Credentials Committee Team Chair, Darren Adwalpalker (Brent Miller filling in for Darren while he was on sabbatical), SAFE Chair Cassandra Garrett, San Diego County Churches of God, Inc. Chair Bill Kottcamp, San Diego County Ministers' Fellowship President Rodney Corley, Christian Women Connection President (for several years) Caroline Denton, and now the new Co-Presidents Debi Francis

& Kim Darby, Association Office Manager Paula Larsen, each and every team's members who serve with these chairpersons, and especially the dedicated pastors that serve not only in the local congregation, but in this Association as well.

I also praise God for allowing me to know and share wonderful ministry relationships with the Interstate leadership, especially the Chair, Christopher Conedy and the Credentials Chair, Leroy Harris. Their work also directly affects the health and wellbeing of the church in Southern California and Southern Nevada. We regard the two organizations as being a part of One Church.

I thank God for these who give of themselves for the Kingdom Work so generously, yet with wisdom, care, love and respect for the ministry and for the One who has called us. They have worked diligently together...and I honor them.

Camps, retreats, training events, rallies, unity events, credentialing, conferences, advisory meetings (formal and informal), pastoral search work, ministry team meetings, planning meetings, assisting in pastor/boards planning sabbaticals, these have all occurred through this year. Much good work has taken place. For that I am thankful.

There are a couple of important items not done in the goals we verbalized at the 2016 Annual Meeting that I want to touch on now.

We reported last year that we wanted to work with our pastors in Baja, Mexico to provide a house for Pastor Carlos Rodriguez and his wife. Pastor Carlos suffered a major stroke a few years ago and is in deteriorating health, no longer able to pastor the church. We agreed to build a house for them on the grounds of the camp there. His family asked for the house to be built at another location where they owned property. That did not work, because of a lack of resources on the property...lacking connection with electricity and other essentials. We have made arrangements with the pastors in Baja, who are overseeing the project, that we will provide the housing when the appropriate location is agreed upon within their group and Pastor Carlos' family. We are eager to assist in this partnership venture.

We were wanting to sponsor a Leadership Development trip to Valenzuela, Philippines with older youth/young adults from throughout the Association. We had Summer, 2017 as our goal for the trip. We decided that we wanted to do additional planning and relational development in preparation for this adventure. Humberto Mena and myself went to the Philippines where we walked with our leadership in Valenzuela, and from throughout the Church of God across the nation. Preparations and planning are solid and we are pleased to announce that the trip is scheduled for July, 2018. It will include living and working with our school in Valenzuela (a part of Manila), sharing in Vacation Bible Schools in our congregations in the local Manila area, and also getting to meet and share with children and young people in some of our wonderful village churches. We have been there, met with leadership in each of those congregations and leadership within the villages. The itinerary will provide a very safe and fulfilling experience for the participants. Applications are complete and will be made available at the Annual Meeting.

Looking at the year ahead of us, I see some areas that must be made priority items for our united work together.

We will begin the work of discerning where God is leading the Association in the future, what that will look like, and the changes needed to accomplish that...starting with our Association Bylaws. Earl Gotts and others will be leading as we launch this process.

We have taken significant actions to rework the membership on some of our ministry teams that have not been effective and /or working at all. I am pleased with the work the Administrative Board has done, especially Earl Gotts as the Chair of the Nominations and Personnel Committee, in seeking good leadership for all of our teams. We have some excellent leaders in our Association congregations. It is sometimes very difficult to draw them to the surface beyond the local work. This year we will be focusing on gearing-up our Church Multiplication and Church Health ministry teams. It is so very important that we do so. Please pray for us as we engage in these ministry areas.

Another vital ministry that has been lacking in the last year has been that of our Ministerial Conference. I realize that it does not lie under the direct oversight of the Executive Director or of the Administrative Board. The Association does not name or ratify its leadership. It operates under its own bylaws. Those bylaws do not provide for my oversight or direct involvement as Executive Director. It is overseen by the ministers, ordained and licensed, of Southern California and Southern Nevada. It has not functioned for the last year...except for the areas of credentialing and with the other events I have connected us in my role.

I am under the conviction that our pastors need this to be a strong, healthy, and active organization. In this culture of Southern California and Southern Nevada, where there seems to be a gravitational pull towards independence and individualism, even within the church, we need to intentionally work against this pull. We preach and teach that God ordained the church and that it is His will for us to be together in this spiritual Kingdom venture. We do not model it very successfully in some areas. I have jumpstarted the Ministerial Fellowship twice in the last 18 plus years, personally naming and appointing leadership until they could be ratified by the larger body of ministers. We are in need of that again. BUT...there is a need, a deeper need, for our ministers to have a conversation as to why this is the situation. This ought to be the group that cares for each other, providing for encouragement and training for those in ministry...since they know the needs and the demands of ministry like no one else can.

I believe this is to be a powerful, energizing and 'anointed' ministry of ministers to/with ministers. Please contact me if you agree with me and are willing to assist in discerning God's leading in this very special area of the life of the church. For those lay members reading this, please pray for those who will be stepping-up to lead, and for those who will be generous in their encouragement and support.

THE FUTURE

We will be announcing another opportunity for a specialized ministry team at the Annual Meeting...a Missions Ministry Team. Tune in for more information.

I would not pretend to be able to forecast where we will be in 25 or even 10 years. But let me share where I think God may be leading us in the next 5 years...

- More Hispanic ministry. This will continue to be a growing edge. In just the last few years we have grown (quietly) to eleven Spanish-speaking works in Southern California.
- More languages. For our first many years English was the only language spoken in our churches. Then we had a German-speaking congregation for a few short years. The Church of God planted a Spanish-speaking congregation, and took the Church of God to Mexico. Today, Southern California/Nevada believers worship in English, Spanish, Korean, and Arabic. We are in communication with a Mandarin Chinese group who would like to affiliate with the Church of God.

What languages will be next??

- More diversity. We are seeing a healthy trend in this area. As our congregations become more diverse, they better reflect the ethnic and racial makeup of their mission field and will do better to connect with their neighbors.
- More multi-congregational use of single facilities. For missional as well as stewardship reasons, we will continue to see more than one Church of God congregation using the same building. Often, these congregations will speak different languages.
- More worship attendance challenges. California ranks #3 in the United States of the number of Church of God people in our state. But they attend less regularly than they have in previous times. In the past, a "faithful" Church of God congregant attended 48 50 Sundays a year. Today, that average is about 38 40 Sundays a year. The dynamics of blended families, more travel, non traditional work schedules, and "other" priorities (other activities)) will continue to impact Sunday morning attendance. We must find creative and graceful ways to address this challenge.
- More opportunities for bi-vocational pastors/ministers. The trend toward pastors needing employment outside the church will continue, which has implications for congregational expectations as well as ministerial preparation. This is not necessarily a bad thing. Many of our churches are becoming much more missional because their pastor works in the mission field.
- More opportunities for women in ministry. Our prayer is to see more women in ministry, especially as "lead pastors." As God calls, the church should encourage, nurture, and provide places to serve. It has been very difficult to find placement of females in pastoral ministry roles within our congregations in Southern California/Nevada...especially in that "lead role". Our female "candidates" have found it difficult to be accepted by other females in the pews of our congregations. We have had to help them find placement in other parts of the country where they are better received. In our state where we pride ourselves as being rather progressive, we have some work to do in this area. Key to this will be the intentional leadership development of women of all ages in local churches.
- More preaching on God's transforming grace. Our younger pastors will lead us in finding fresh ways of expressing our message of Christlikeness, transformational holiness, and discipleship that easily connects with our mission field.
- More emphasis on mentoring and leadership development. Many of our pastors and leaders are quickly reaching retirement age(s), or facing the physical limitations to continued leadership. We must disciple others who can take the mantle of leadership. This is intentional, relational leadership development.
- More congregations and ministries. Of all we do, nothing has a greater impact on the future than the planting of new churches. New churches are the most effective evangelism strategy.

The # 1 lesson we have learned about church planting is that the least effective way to plant churches is by districts or the Association. Churches plant a few churches. People plant churches — people who hear God's call to start something new and respond with faith and courage. God continues to call, praise His name.

Let me close with my invitation for you to attend the Annual Meeting on Saturday, October 14 at the College Park Church of God in Long Beach. It will be from 10:00 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. The theme for the day is: "Raising A Generation to Lead". We have invited some very special speakers and conference leaders who have a wonderful story of being raised to lead and raising others to lead. There will be a wonderful conference in the morning for all of us led by Rev. Kimberly Dirmann, a leader in the Foursquare Churches in Southern California. There will be a special conference in the afternoon for high school and college aged young adults and another for adults. We will close with a unique and inspirational worship service, with the music leadership of the Worship Team from South Bay Church of God in Torrance and the preaching of Pastor Geremy Dixon, of the First Church of God, Center of Hope in Inglewood. This service will include a special recognition of ordination and licensing to ministry.

Do not miss this great day!!

Firstly, I would like to thank all of the ministers for investing in our young people in their home churches and for supporting our work with them at the district level. Our Youth Ministry Team wants nothing more than to see our kids know and grow in Christ, and we have been relentlessly following God's leading to accomplish this goal.

Where we have been... In these last few years, we have seen great spiritual gains in our youth as we've moved through a God-given focus for each year:

- In 2015, our focus was on being ROOTED in Christ and with each other. Like the mighty sequoias that we see each year at camp, we grow taller and reach new heights when we are growing side by side. In this year we saw greater <u>unity</u> amongst our students and leaders.
- ↓ In 2016, our focus was to have students U-TURN to the Lord in prayer. After an intense time of learning and prayer, God gave us all an opportunity to witness the power of prayer first-hand. The day that we returned from camp, Youth Ministry Team member Minister Cameron Bell, was shot six times at his home. His family, and our youth and their families from around the district immediately covered him in prayer and we saw prayers answered as God in His grace, restored him. We are deeply grateful to the Lord to still have Minister Cam on this side of heaven, and the youth are reminded of God's work and the power of their prayer each time we get together.
- ♣ In 2017 we SUBMERGED ourselves in the Father's presence and in His Word. Students had this to say about our last camp together:

"At camp I learned that I have a job to do that was assigned to me by God. I need to build His kingdom and bring His kingdom down to earth. This really touched me because I have trouble talking about God, church, or even the Bible. Through camp I learned that I need to be a Christian, not just do Christian things. I need to walk in my faith, which might look weird to other people, but to me there should be no other way to walk. I need to become more confident in my self, faith, and God in order to complete the job God has assigned to me and to all of us. In order for me to do this I am beginning to pray more... listen, dive into the Word more, and try to worship more by doing things through Him."

"I learned to be a "be-er" not a do-er. We should be a "be-er" because if we go to church and do some worship and listen to God talk to us and just go home and continue our wordly lives then we are just do-ers; not doing what God wants us to do... We need to be what God wants us to be and not do what we want to do first. Before [coming to camp] I didn't pray a lot and read the word, but I took this to heart and began to pray and be closer to God."

Where are we going in 2018... We are excited about the upcoming year, as God is revealing to us that He is a HEALER of this generation and calls our young people to be agents of His Healing power. Our NYEE event and Camp will focus on how to help our students put every aspect of their lives into His Healing Hands and to help them become a force for healing in their home communities.
